We hope that you find it easy to follow along and we encourage you to sing out for our congregational hymns.*

H indicates the 1982 Hymnal, L is LEVAS.

A note on today's liturgy.

Throughout the season of Eastertide, including the day of Pentecost, you may have noticed that the confession of sin has been omitted. It is not because we miraculously stopped sinning; rather, as a tradition in the Episcopal church, it is a reminder that Christ lived, died and was raised for us for the forgiveness of sin. Today we resume the Confession after the Nicene Creed and before the Peace.

The Presider continues,

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."
